





### The 475th News

Our registering and bar were in a suite just off the patio. We were able to take our drinks out onto it and sit there in the California sun soaking up the rays. It was a very calm and serene setting and seemed to be miles away from the hustle and bustle of the real world. All who wanted were treated to a tour of the inn. It is a fascinating place just dripping with history. While its main decor is Spanish Mission it has enough antiques to satisfy the most discriminating palate. It is unique! The Mission Inn seemed to be the perfect place for such a reunion. It was so enjoyable that it was agreed that we should meet there again in a couple of years. There were other reasons for that also. Here we saw the exhibit of 475th memorabilia which at present is in the middle of the base's museum but in the near future will be in its own museum adjacent to the present location. The exhibit recalled a thousand memories to those who had served in the group in WWII. At every exhibit there were the familiar words, "Remember when—"

Pete Madison led the dedication of the museum exhibit and introduced many of the base personnel as well as seven of our Aces and a C.M.H. winner. The Aces were well known to all of you, in alphabetic order, P.J. Dahl, Joe Forster, John Loisel, Warren Louis, John Purdy, Bo Reeves and Cal Wire. Our guest, Col. Lew Millett, won his C.M.H. in Korea.

Many of the people involved in the base were introduced. SMSGT Tim Colburn is Director of the Museum. Dave McPhee is Base Civil Engr.. Joy Defenbaugh is a Councilwoman involved in the uses of the base. Col. Steve Clark is Realignment Officer.

After walking down memory lane inside we went outside of the building for a fly-over by Cmdr. Ed Schneider in an F18.

Cmdr. Schneider holds a Navy commission but flies for NASA. Then on to the buses and off to the Officer's Club for dinner. We got there in time to add to the crowd and confusion of the Friday night Happy Hour. But as resourceful as we are we managed to get our drinks.

At the dinner we had most of the people from the museum as our guests along with our bus drivers and Col. & Mrs. Steve Scott. After dinner we had a talk, with slides by Cmdr. Schneider on the SR71 a truly fantastic plane which is one of our "eyes in the skies".

Saturday was a day of reminiscing and re-fighting the war. We won. At 3:00 there was a ceremony at the Flyers' Wall where Col. MacDonald's wings were added to the many famous ones already there including Mat McGuire and Charles Lindberg. As you recall both of them flew with the 475th. It was mentioned that Maj. Bong's should be there also and an effort should be made to see that happen. He too made some flights with the 475th although he was in the 49th. Some of his family were there for the events.

That evening there was a wine and cheese party, hosted by the Mission Inn, at poolside, for our group. No one went swimming. Then into the Music Room for our banquet.

On Sunday Morning the group had it's breakfast and business meeting in the Music room. After that it was head for home.

For those of you who couldn't join us at Riverside this is to let you know that we are in the process of building our own 475th Fighter Group Museum.



#### **475TH REUNION CRUISE**



Do you recognize anyone in the pictures? Drop him a note.

Contact us. Let us know what your thoughts are. Do you have any ideas for or about reunions? Do you know how we can get more members out to them? Would you help with them? What can be done to make them bigger and better?

### **PASSINGS**

John Babel of the 433rd died on the 31st of October 1995.

Carl A. King of the 431st died this month.

William Hanning of the 431st died on 17 December 1995.

#### **SEARCH & RESCUE!!!**

Where are they??? It is estimated that about 3,000 men served in the 475th during WWII. This is based on the fact that when Col. Loisel took over as C.O. the duty roster listed about 1,250 men. Almost none of these were originals from Australia. so that meant that there was a complete turn-over in personnel, and more were added .But we haven't found all of them. So let us SEARCH for them and RESCUE them from oblivion.

At the present time we have 548 names on our mailing list. When you deduct the duplicates for those having winter and summer addresses and the Honorary members, we are talking 500 men. We have a list of about 100 who were on our list at one time but moved without notifying us and their mail has been returned as "undeliverable". Then we have the big list of almost 1,200 names of people we have never been able to contact. And last, but not least, we have those whose names we never got.

These lists come mainly out of the "Blue Book" which was published before WWII ended .Then we have Ronald Yoshino's "Lightning Strikes". Both of these we know are not complete. Any one of us can recall names of men who we know were in the outfit but whose names are not listed. So the list of missing is in the neighborhood of 2,000. If anyone can

come up with better sources please let us know. We know many have passed on and we have no list of those. Should we?

Now comes the big question, who is willing to Search?? For those that are willing, lists can be provided. These can be printed up by either squadron or by state, of the last known address. Naturally the addresses of the 1,200 never contacted are 50 years old. But it is a starting point. If you know of any not listed in the "Blue Book" let us know so they can be added to the list. Our museum should at least have a complete list of those who served. We should have a complete list of those who are still with us.

For anyone willing to search contact: Curt Tinker, P.O. Box 498, Intervale, NH 03845-0498, Tel: (603) 356-6099. Let him know where you are willing to look and what list you want. Good places to start your search are telephone books and city directories. If you have access to the CDROM listing all the telephone numbers and addresses in the USA you could start there. Anyone belonging to a fraternal or veteran organization which has a publication could try and put a notice in that. Anyone wishing to add names which we don't have please write them out and send them to the address above. Let's try and find all the 475th members before it is too late!

Sunday, 8 October 1995


