overwhelming and I, along with many others, could not stop the tears from swelling as they opened with the Glenn Miller favorite "In the Mood".



**GET TO KNOW YOUR 475TH MEMBERS** 

In this edition we get to know Victor Meyer.

Victor E. Meyer, originally from Shiner, Texas joined the Army Air Corps in August, 1939 and left the Air Force in December, 1970. Here is his story:

I enlisted at Randolph Field near San Antonio. I went to 52nd School Squadron where I did Basic in the basement of the barracks.

I was assigned as an apprentice mechanic - OJT working on Primary Training Aircraft. Before going to the Pacific I went from Randolph to Langley AFB, VA with the 8th Pursuit GP, 35th Fighter Squadron, then to Mitchell Field Long Island New York. Six month maneuvers to Barksdale Field LA and Greensboro NC. From Mitchell AFB I was in charge of 60 men to Hamilton Field California which became Hamilton

Field Combat team. I left Hamilton January 12, 1942 on the ship President Coolidge and arrived in Melbourne, Australia February 2, 1942. I went to Royal Park for a few days and then on to Adelaide and then to Port Pirie. On February 19, 1942 we left for Darwin, Australia and arrived over Darwin but could not land there due to the bombing of Darwin so we landed 60 miles from Darwin at Batchelor Field, Northern Territory. Our combat team was supposed to maintain 60 P40's at Darwin that were all lost in the raid on Darwin. This all was an effort to raze Java. At Batchelor we had A-24 Dive Bombers which we crewed with the 17th Bomb Squadron.

On March 31, 1942, we moved to Darwin, gained the 9th Pursuit Squadron of the 49th Group and I was assigned as crew chief of a P-40. LT Manning was my pilot. April 28, 1942 we left Bachelor Field in a C-57, Lockheed Transport, but had a forced landing in Richmond QLD in a cow pasture. We boarded a train to Townsville QLD which took 24 hours. There I joined the 36th Pursuit Squadron, 8th Group where I crewed P-39's. The 36th was the first U.S. Fighter Squadron in New Guinea, Port Moresby. The 36th lost all their planes in Moresby, went to Townsville and got more P-39's and went to Milne Bay New Guinea for six months where almost all had malaria. Only 12 men in the Squadron did not have malaria; I was 1 of 12 who did not have malaria. From Milne Bay we went to Mareeba QLD, Australia then back to Moresby on May 16, 1943. On June 27, 1943 we left Moresby on a C-53 transport bound for Townsville and then to Brisbane QLD by train. On June 30, 1943 I joined the 432nd Fighter Squadron of the 475th Group at Amberly Field. My favorite memory of the 475th is when we finally got a plane that was able to shoot down "Jap" planes. I had many friends in the 475th. Genarlsky in the 433rd - he was second in command of the Combat Team. Among others - Magann, Booker, Price, Vogt, Beecher, Plecker, Stein, Kennington, Yates, Greenberg, Sandvig, Rawalli, Hodel, Bigelow, Powell, Dygas, Pinkerton, Heap, Eiler, Jones, Giraud, Kabaly, Brown, Bishop, Kupnewski, and Morrow. I remember a story of when an Army truck brought a load of butter and we had pancakes for a week; that was a real treat. I bonded with my main pilot - Campbell P. M. Wilson. I crewed about ten different P-38's and different models – I lost three planes due to non-combat reasons: one to an enemy Ack-Ack with a gaping hole in the wing – one that took off from a forward base and landed in the water, Pilot Wilson was saved – and another to a coolant system contamination.

The best thing that I got from home was mail. I spent time in the hospital with Dengue fever in Dobochura. I left the 432nd in Biak, after Lae, Nadzab, and Hollandia, on September 16, 1944 to go to Finchafen Rotation Camp. I left there on November 15, 1944 for the U.S. A. I got married in Australia to Agnes Grace Kerley on October 1, 1943. We had two sons and one daughter and six grand children. My wife died on January 25, 2011. I left the military in 1944 for six months and then reenlisted. I retired with 30 years of service as Chief Master Sergeant in December, 1970. As a civilian, I stayed in the aircraft maintenance field. I acquired an aircraft and power plant license while I was in the service and it was key to several jobs that I had. I worked till I was 72 years old. Seven years civil service in maintenance helped my retirement pay. My last duty station was Hawaii at Hickam, AFB where my two sons got married. I moved to San Antonio, Texas where I worked in maintenance of aircraft. Three years later I moved back to Hawaii. I have all my family in Hawaii and that is the best thing about retirement.

I might mention that of 30 years in the military, 10 were spent overseas during wartime, WWII, Korea, Vietnam.
